About the Sacraments

In order to benefit from this opportunity children need to be in Year 3 or above. As loving and caring parents you will be anxious to help your child prepare for their First Holy Communion. These events are cause for great celebration within your own family and in the family of the Church. The Eucharist is the centre and heart of Christian life for us all. The first time a child receives Jesus in Holy Communion, the joy on their faces and indeed in their hearts is a privilege to see. The most important point to remember is that this is a step in the life of faith of your child. First Holy Communion Day is a day of thanksgiving to God for having brought you this far as a family and a confident prayer for the future of your child. But, just as importantly, it is the beginning of a new relationship of your child with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, a relationship which will last a lifetime. Preparing children for First Reconciliation and Communion allows them to come to a new understanding of their faith as well as the Mass and its different elements.

Outline of the Course

Many people will be involved in preparing you and your child for the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Preparation for such important events starts in the loving environment of the family. Just as you teach your children how to behave and how to use a knife and fork, so your involvement in the First Sacraments Programme will endorse the Eucharistic themes of listening, caring, giving thanks and so on. As you will be taking the course with your child, it is a wonderful opportunity for parents to awaken within themselves a 'living' faith so that they may be a true Christian witness for their children. As part of this, the children will be involved in charity giving in some way on a weekend during Lent. We will again run two separate programmes in both churches (Holy Name 10am Sunday **or** OLOL 4.50pm Saturday). Lessons will run regularly during term time between January and May. All children and parents must attend the Mass before/after the lesson each week. The children will take part in some of the Liturgies during the course. Children and a parent are expected to attend <u>every</u> lesson (please diarise dates below).
