Newsletter 25th April 2025 Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Pope Francis

When Pope Francis left hospital before Easter even my non-medical eye wondered how long he would have to live. We did not have to wait that long. The last day of his life said so much about the man: he received the US Vice President; and then he insisted on going out to meet his flock in St Peter's Square. The courage needed to do the latter defies belief as he must have been in pain but saying goodbye to normal people was so important to him. The day after his death I looked at the newsstand in my local Sainsbury's. Every headline was about Pope Francis. TV and Radio gave wall to wall coverage of his death and life with everyone praising his humility and integrity. He walked the talk. People could really identify with him. He did not care about the trappings of power. In Buenos Aires he travelled on a bus and his Popemobile was a Fiat and not a Mercedes. After his election he addressed the crowd from the balcony of St Peters with a simple "good evening". The next day he went on his own to settle his hotel bill. He did not live in the Vatican Palace but in a simple hotel eating his meals in the cafeteria. His first trip as Pope was to Lampedusa the Italian island where many refuges transit. He was famously non-judgemental: "Who am I to judge? ' Of course he did not get everything right . No human can. But people Catholic and non-Catholic loved the person: he was a real person who cared about us. And we should pray for his successor as Francis will be a hard act to follow. **Chris Bourne**
